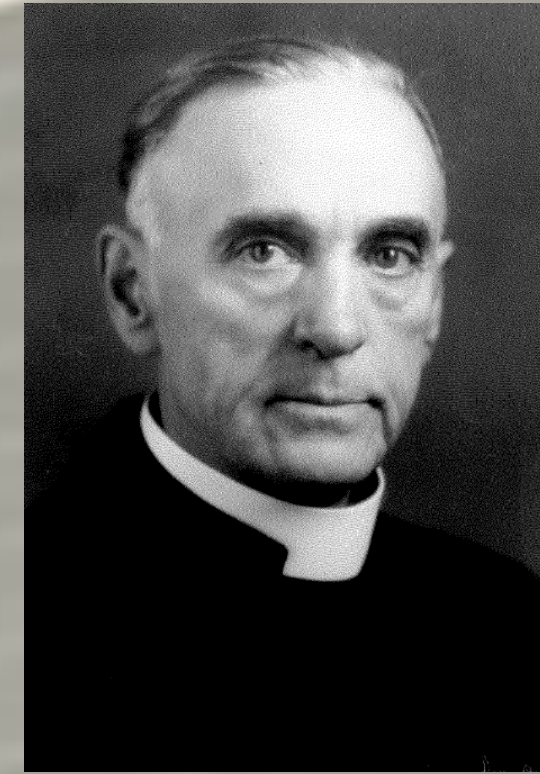


Bishop Joseph Busch of St. Cloud Diocese asked Rev. Edward Mahoney to call a meeting with St. Cloud west-end community regarding the building of a church on the west side of the city



OCT 1, 1920  
Fr. Frederick Hinnenkamp appointed first pastor of Saint Anthony Parish



FALL 1920  
Low framed building was erected for the Church

FEB 5, 1921  
First sacramental wedding for Mary Bruns and Kenneth Bookey

SEP 1921  
School doors opened with two classrooms and two teachers, Benedictine Sisters: Alicia Bussen and Dolorate Venner



MAY 1922  
First eighth grade graduation:  
Alma Bruns, Thomas Cremers, Mary Englehard, Roert Frie, George Halupozok, Paul Kiklas, Florence Lahr, Helen Lenzmeier, Margaret Reaser, Raymond Scheuer, Maurice Smith, Alfred Stockinger, Florence Terfehr, and Frederick Waldorf

NOV 26, 1922  
New church basement was blessed, dedicated for services

OCT 23, 1923  
"An Old Fashioned Mother" was staged; one of the many plays put on by the St Anthony parishioners



1928  
Construction of a new eight room school began in Spring and was ready to use by November

AUG 8, 1920  
Picnic fundraising at Colonial Gardens was attended by about 6000 people raising approximately \$1200 for the church building

1920  
Katherine & John Schwartz donated land for the church which was named the parish of Saint Anthony of Padua after Katherine's father, Anton Rengel

DEC 12, 1920  
First Mass celebrated with 150 families registered as parishioners. First baptism on the same day was for Adeline Mary Irmiter, daughter of Hubert and Catherine

SPRING 1921  
Church purchased the old Jefferson School along with all of its contents and moving expenses for \$1000



OCT 8, 1921  
The sisters moved into their new convent at 1st St and 24th Ave, purchased from Thomas Fitzpatrick



JUN 1922  
First Confirmation with Bishop Joseph Busch. Board approved plans to build a basement church. A new church was quickly built.

FEB 23, 1923  
First funeral mass for Elmer Bookey, age 1

1927  
School enrollment at 340 students
